
Service Area

- Recycled & Nonpotable Water
- Regional Stormwater Protection & Flood Control
- Wastewater Treatment (sewage collection)
- Water Conservation Advocacy













Board of Directors

Governed by a 5-member, elected **Board of Directors**

- Publicly elected
- Four-year terms
- Represent five divisions
- Set policy and represent ratepayers

Work everyday to keep water flowing to homes and businesses:

- Maintain training, certifications & education
- Work on critical tasks serving the community, public health is a priority
- Operate, repair and maintain thousands of miles of pipelines, fire hydrants, valves and many facilities
- Monitor water system and collect more than 18,000 water samples per year – to ensure high quality tap water

- Advocate for local residents on legislation and regulations
















